Announcement of Stanford Humanities and International Studies Fellowships 2008-2009

Online Application Deadline: December 3, 2007

The Stanford Humanities Center (SHC) and the Freeman Spogli Institute for International Studies (FSI) will jointly award two international studies fellowships for the academic year 2008-2009 to junior or senior scholars who are not U.S. nationals.

The proposals by applicants should focus on themes of international studies compatible with the mission of one of FSI's research centers: The Walter H. Shorenstein Asia/Pacific Research Center (Shorenstein APARC); Center on Democracy, Development, and the Rule of Law (CDDRL); Center for Health Policy (CHP/PCOR); Center for International Security and Cooperation (CISAC); or the Forum on Contemporary Europe (FCE).

Eligible areas include, but are not limited to: history, philosophy, languages, literature, linguistics, archeology, ethics, comparative religion, and history and criticism of the arts. Proposals are welcome from the social sciences employing historical or philosophical approaches, such as social and cultural anthropology, sociology, political theory, and other subjects concerned with questions of value. Fellows are awarded stipends of up to \$60,000 and a housing and moving allowance of up to \$15,000, dependent upon need.
