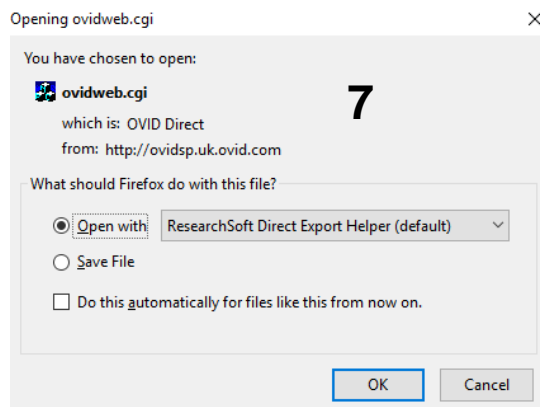

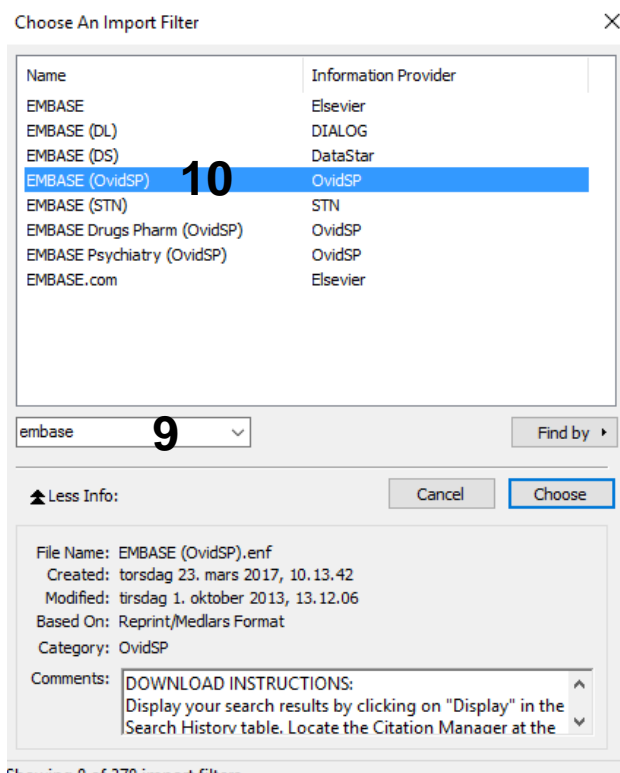
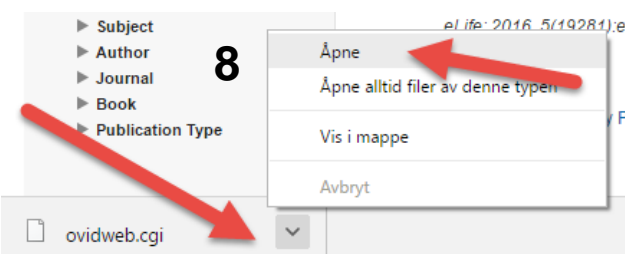

Firefox: Click «**OK**» when you get this window **(7)**.

Chrome: The import file is automatically stored and you must open it afterward **(8)**.

Microsoft Edge: The import file will normally open directly in EndNote.



Presently, there is not a designated EndNote import filter for Ovid Global Health. Search for the Embase Ovid filter **(9)** and choose this filter **(10)**. Finish with "**Choose**"

EndNote will now only list the imported references. We recommend that you check a couple of references to see that the import was correct.
