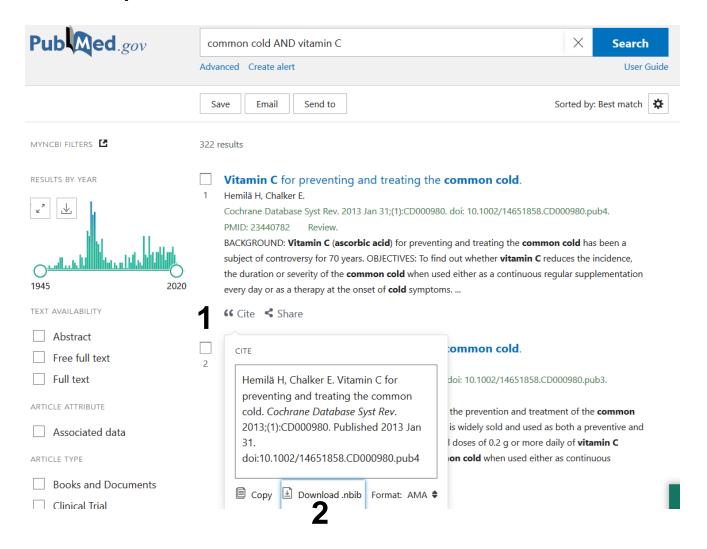


Direct import of references from New PubMed

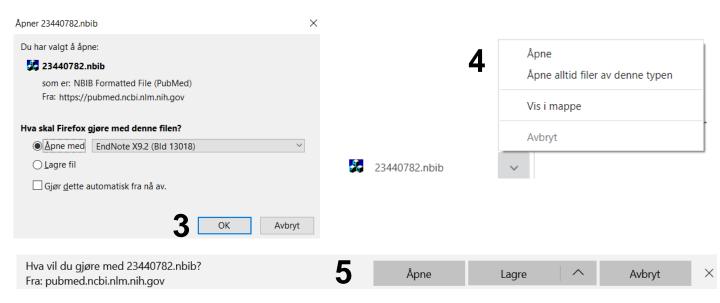
Make a back up of your EndNote library before doing major changes or imports to EndNote!

How to import individual references:



Search PubMed. Go to **«Cite»** (1) below the reference you want to import to EndNote. Choose "**Download .nbib**" (2) from the box. What happens next depend on your chosen web browser. The reference may be sent directly to Endnote, or you may have to specify that the export file should be opened in EndNote. See next page for some examples.





If you use **Firefox**, click "**OK**" (3) in the window that appear and the reference will be sent to your library. NB! Choose «**Open with**» (5) if this is not the default setting.

If you use **Google Chrome**, choose **"Open"** or **"Always open..." (4)** as the next step for the saved file located on the bottom left side of the screen (Norwegian menu in the figure).

If you use **Internet Explorer**, choose "Open" (5) (Norwegian menu in the figure).

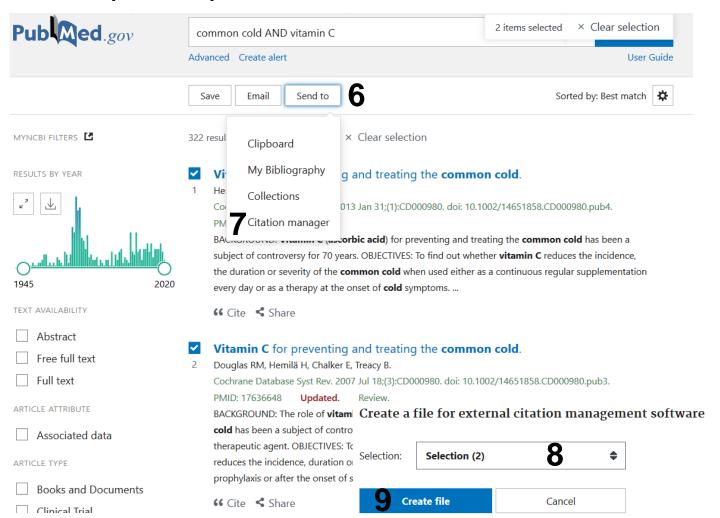
If you use **Safari** on a **Mac**, the web browser will automatically save the import file in the download folder. Go to the download folder and find the file (.nbib) and drag the file onto the EndNote program icon in the bottom of the screen. Sometimes you will be asked to confirm which library the import should go to. icon in the bottom of the screen. The references will be imported directly to your library.

EndNote will now only list the imported references. We recommend that you check a couple of references to see that the import was correct. In our experience, imports from PubMed are usually correct.

Choose "Show all references" from the "References" menu to see all references in your library.



How to import multiple references:



Search PubMed. Tick the references that you want to import to EndNote. Choose **«Send to» (6)** and **"Citation manager" (7)**. It is possible to import all references in the result list by choosing this in **Selection" (8)**. Choose **"Create file" (9)**. What happens next depend on your chosen web browser. The reference may be sent directly to Endnote, or you may have to specify that the export file should be opened in EndNote. See examples in previous page **(3-5)**.

EndNote will now only list the imported references. We recommend that you check a couple of references to see that the import was correct. In our experience, imports from PubMed are usually correct.

Choose "Show all references" from the "References" menu to see all references in your library.
