

Instructions to authors

Gunneria presents original work in monographs and anthologies related to the museum's area of responsibility and academic areas, i.e. biology, archaeology and cultural history. All research papers are subjected to peer review.

Gunneria is an open access online journal (from issue 80) under a CC-BY 4.0 license and immediately available for anyone free of charge. The submitting author is responsible for permissions to use and share copyrighted materials as pictures, maps, previously published tables, figures etc. under the [CC-BY 4.0 license](#). Include written permissions from the holders of the copyrights with the manuscript submission, as acknowledgement alone is not sufficient.

Language and style

Contributions are accepted in English and Norwegian, or exceptionally other languages. In case of papers submitted in other languages than English, the title page, summary, table headings and figure legends should also be submitted in English. Manuscripts should follow the "Instructions to authors" as closely as possible.

Manuscripts

Organize the manuscript as left justified, with wide margins, double spaced and numbered lines to aid the referees. Manuscripts should have a title with author names, institutions and postal addresses, a suggested running heading (50 characters or less) and an abstract in English presenting main results and conclusions. Abstract should not exceed 300 words. Clearly state the name and e-mail address of the corresponding author.

Articles should be organized in sections labelled Introduction, Material and methods, Results, Discussion and References. All acknowledgements

should be collected under a single heading at the end of the text. Reviews and monographs may be organized differently.

Figures and tables

Tables with their headings, legend to figures and numbered figures should be on separate pages following the text, however their preferred location in the text should be clearly marked by <INSERT TABLE/FIGURE xx HERE>. Illustrations of print quality are submitted in separate files labelled with their preferred number xx.

References

In the text, references should be quoted as Brown (2010), Brown & White (2013) or if more than two authors, Green et al. (1999). Multiple references should be given as “Several authors have reported (Green et al. 1999, Brown 2010, Brown & White 2013)” i.e. in chronological order, no comma between name and year.

Lists of references are to be unnumbered and in alphabetical order. The international alphabetical order of Scandinavian and German vowels is: Å = AA, Æ and Ä = AE, Ø and Ö = OE, Ü = UE. Indicate 1st, 2nd, 3rd etc. works by the same author in the same year by a, b, c, etc. (Moen 2010a). Titles of journal should be written in full, according to the following examples:
