

JPI Oceans

- High-level strategic process that exists, long-term integrated approach to marine and maritime research and technology development
- Focused on solving the <u>societal</u> challenges of our seas and oceans that cannot be solved solely on the national level.
- Integrating platform across disciplines and sectors, open to all MS and AC with an interest in marine maritime research.
- Alignment through developing joint research programmes and other instruments, tools and initiatives.
- Actions take on the form of "fit for purpose solutions" involving users and producers of the research
- MarTERA is related to Strategic Area 2 on "Technology and Sensor Developments".





What is MarTERA

- An ERA-NET cofund transnational consortium of funding agencies launch a call for proposals, expected in Nov-Dec 2016
- Expected deadline for submission of proposals: Feb/Mar
 2017
- Scope: Five broad thematic areas: marine and maritime technologies
- Focus on innovation industry participation mandatory in each project
- Partnership between JPI Oceans and MARTEC II



MARTEC II (2011-2015)

- A network developing maritime technologies
- Coordinated by Jülich (DE)
- Norway participated through MAROFF



ERA-NET Cofund Instrument

- Implemented by the Member countries as transnational call for proposal with EU co-funding (50%)
- In addition to the co-funded call other joint activities including other joint calls without EU co-funding



H2020 BG-05-2016: ERA-NET Cofund on marine technologies

Objectives and Impact expected by the Commission to funding agencies but also towards activities undertaken

- Support trans-national, pan-European research networks and synergies
- Adopt a **cross-cutting** approach in technology development so as to benefit multiple sectors/markets
- Pursue **innovation** as a means to tackle global challenges, such as the lack of strategic resources, while minimizing impact on the environment.
- Help implement the European strategy on **Key Enabling Technologies** (KETs), in particular with regards to advanced materials and manufacturing.
- Facilitate economies of scale and research investment efficiency by better aligning national/regional research programmes, in particular within the Joint Programming Initiative "Healthy and Productive Seas and Oceans".



MarTERA Budget: 30 Mio. €

20 Mio. € from MS

10 Mio. € from EU

Available **budget** for Norwegian partners (through RCN and EU): Euro (48-64 mil. NOK)

Priority Areas

- 1. Environmentally friendly maritime technologies
- 2. Development of novel materials and structures
- 3. Sensors, automation, monitoring and observations
- 4. Advanced manufacturing and production
- 5. Safety and Security

Nov-Dec 2016: Launch of the co-funded call (est.)

Feb-Mar 2017: Deadline for submission of proposals (est.)

Two-stage process

- The ranking list must be respected
- Part of the EU contribution will be used as "real pot" money
- Additional partners/countries can still join
- Some partners might fund only industry or only research institutes etc.
- At least two partners from two countries for each project.
