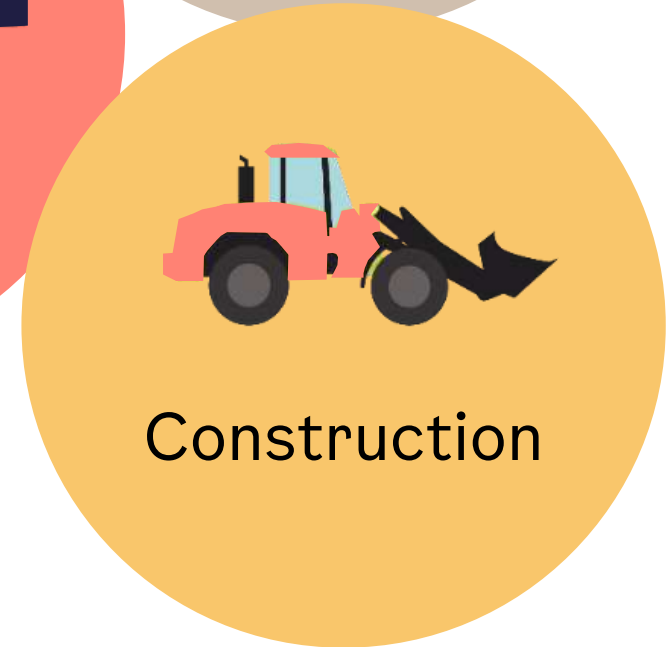
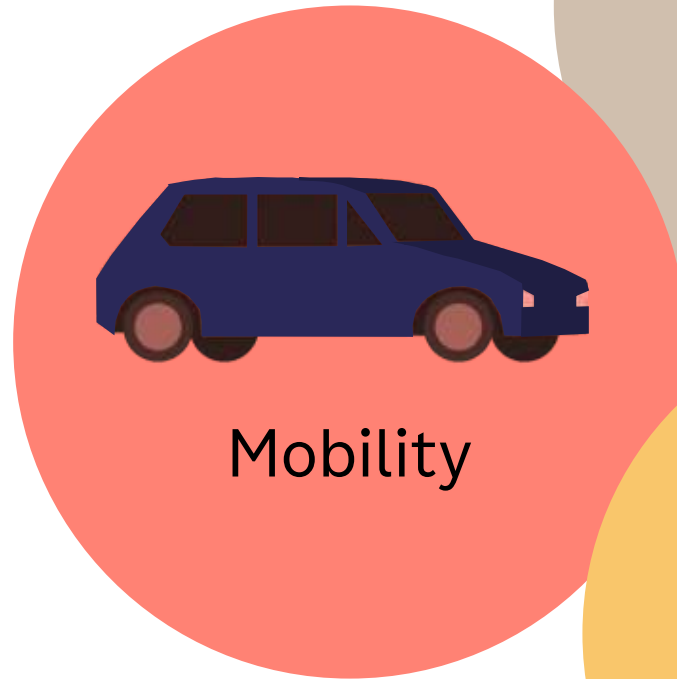
By 2050 urban population will increase by 2.5 billion people

Key Challenges & Efforts

- ▶ Mobility, Waste and Construction
 - All Non-ETS, represents 90% of Oslo CO₂ emissions
- ▶ Priority: To pursue key sources through City level measures, such as
 - Public transport & procurement
 - Planning & Zoning regulations
 - Climate governance
